and attentive to her work. She is a kind and genuinely nice young woman. We would like to thank and recognize Makayla for these wonderful qualities.

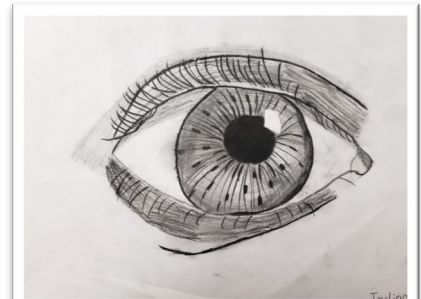

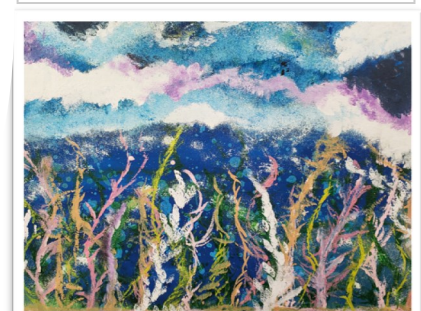

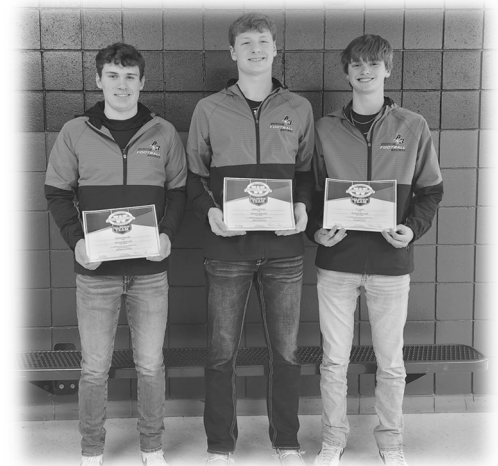
