for calves, sheep, and goats. Great job putting knowledge into action!



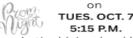

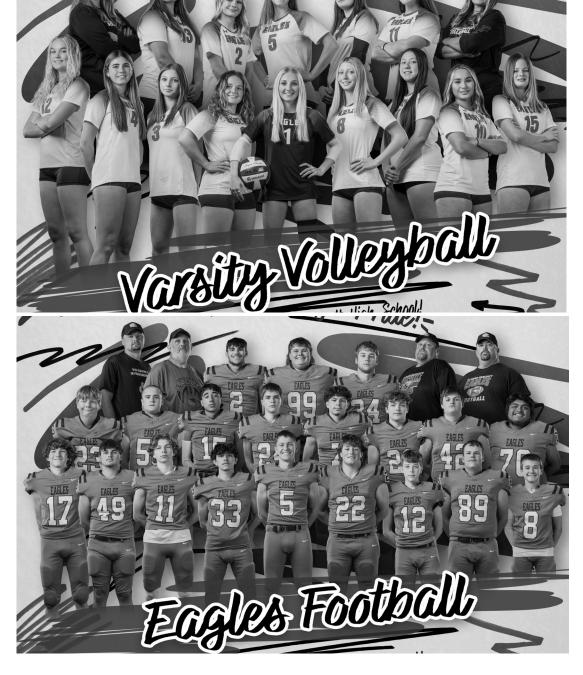

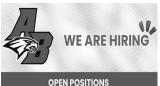
ALMOND-BANCROFT VETERANS DAY PROGRAM
